Describes 9 Indian tricks, revealing their secrets, the author's favorite being a trick involving 3 snakes and a baby crocodile.

Major Lionel Hugh Branson was a British magician and officer of the British Indian Army. Branson had incorporated his magic skills into his military service. His stage magician's name was *Lionel Cardac*. He was a member of *The Magic Circle*, and devoted a whole chapter to debunking the Indian rope trick in his book *Indian Conjuring* (1922). He offered a large sum of money to anyone who could perform the Indian rope trick, nobody ever won the money. [Wikip.].

First edition, with Latin and French texts, of this lavishly illustrated work, replete with scientific details on each species of bird, the entire work is thus one of the most important and detailed ornithological works published in France in the 18th century.



WHITE COCKATOO

“The white cockatoo (*Cacatua alba*), which was first described by French zoologist Mathurin Jacques Brisson in 1760 using the name” (*Cacatua/Kakatoes*). “Although Brisson used this name, the International Commission on Zoological Nomenclature (ICZN) did not recognize him as the authority at that time” – Wikip.



PERDRIX DU SÉNÉGAL [Senegalese partridge & quail] & CAILLE DE MADAGASCAR [Madagascar quail]

“Written by one of the greatest connoisseurs of birds of the time, the work deals with 1336 species. Brisson knew by sight more than 800 of the species he described. The plates, which are folded, were drawn and engraved by Martinet. Both artistically and as accurate detail studies they are better than those of most of his predecessors.” – Anker 69.

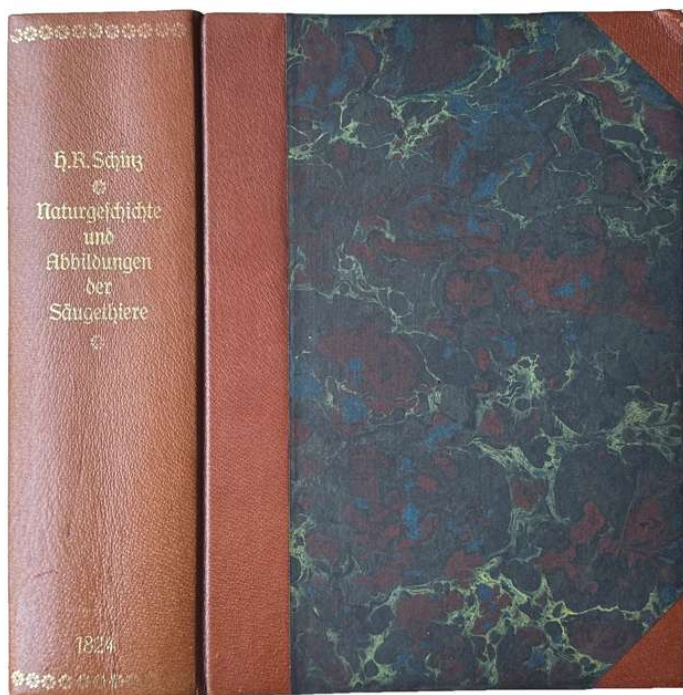

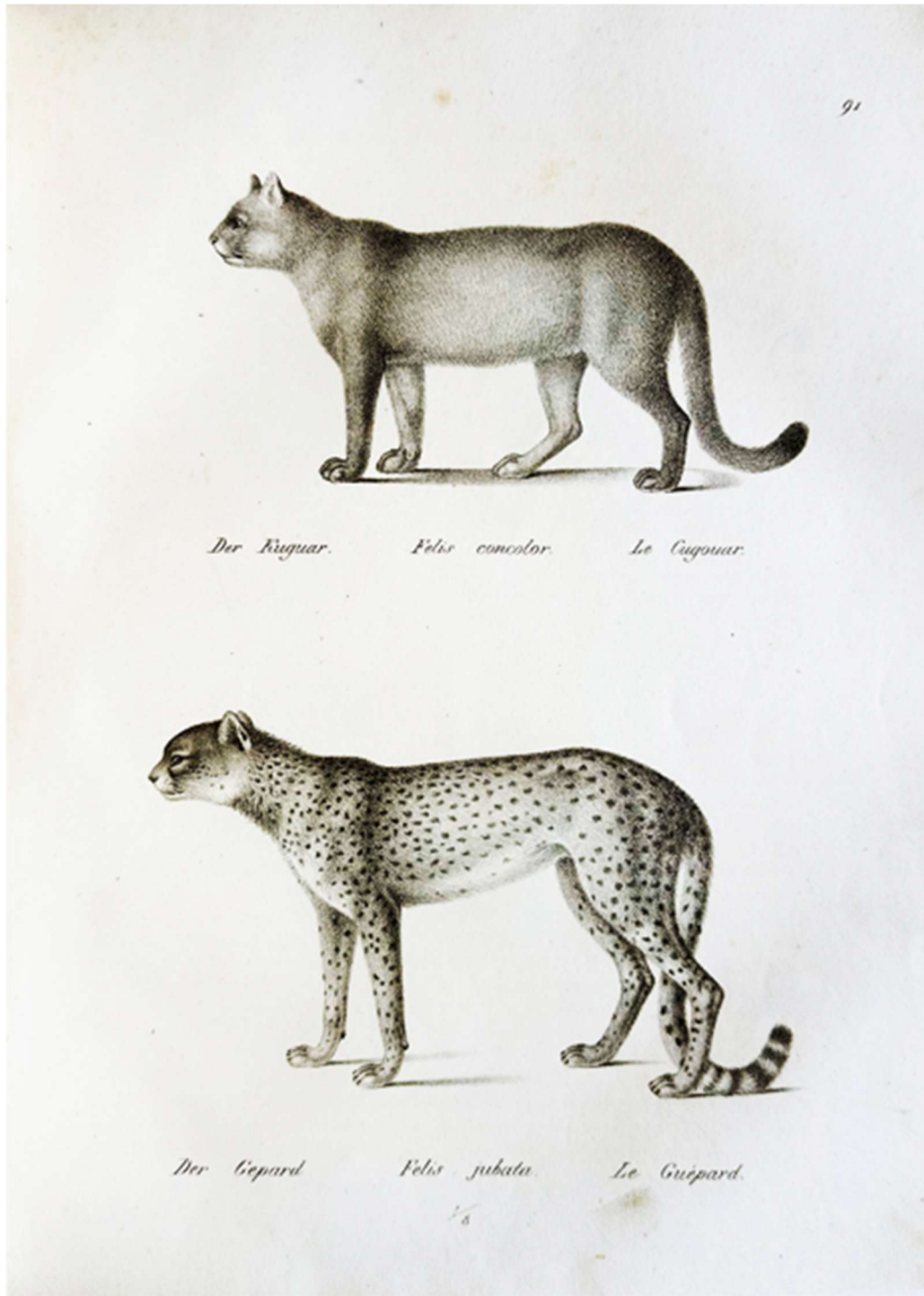

First edition, this book featuring descriptions and beautiful plates celebrating the animal kingdom, being the natural history of mammals. Often bound separately, in this case the text and the plates are bound together. Copies were issued with hand-coloring. This is one of the uncolored examples.

Complete copy of the richly illustrated natural history of mammals including humans. The beautiful plates depict species from all over the world, including Russia, North America, Africa, etc. All the mammals are beautifully drawn and printed in fine lithography, showing monkeys, bats, rodents, armadillos, platypuses, rhinoceros, gazelles, antelopes, dolphins and whales, dogs (St. Bernard, Newfoundland hound), horses (Arabian, Persian (pl. 132), Turkish, Tartar, Spanish, English, a fallen French soldier with his sympathetic horse (pl. 145), big cats (pl. 85 with a man enjoying the company of his 3 tamed big cats; lions, tigers, leopard),

zebras, kangaroos of different types, elephants, Hippos, Rhinoceros, and much more, some with fossils. The plates are all named in German, French and Latin.

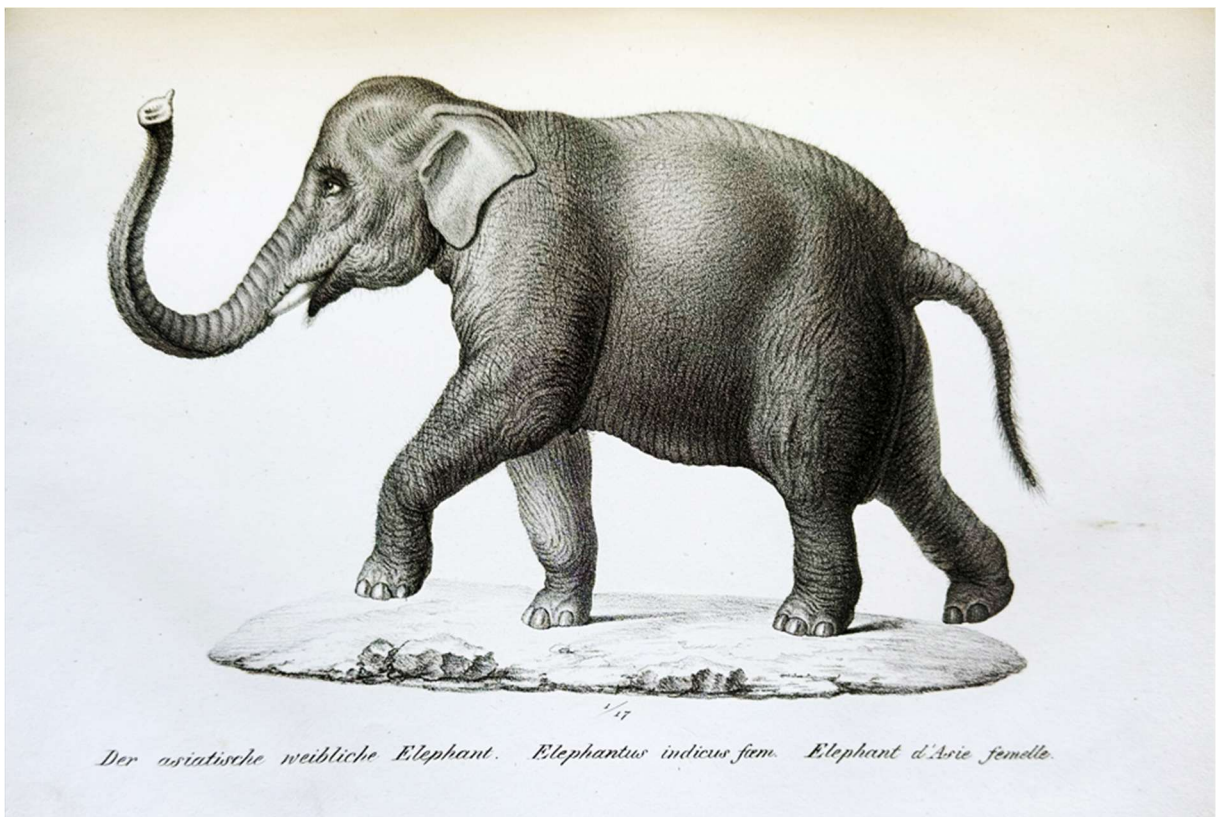


Karl Joseph/Ioseph Brodtmann was a Swiss-German artist and lithographer, as well as a printmaker, publisher and bookseller. He worked in Zürich and Schaffhausen. Brodtmann's natural history lithographs, besides this one, include Heinrich Rudolf Schinz's works on reptiles and birds, published in the early 1830s.

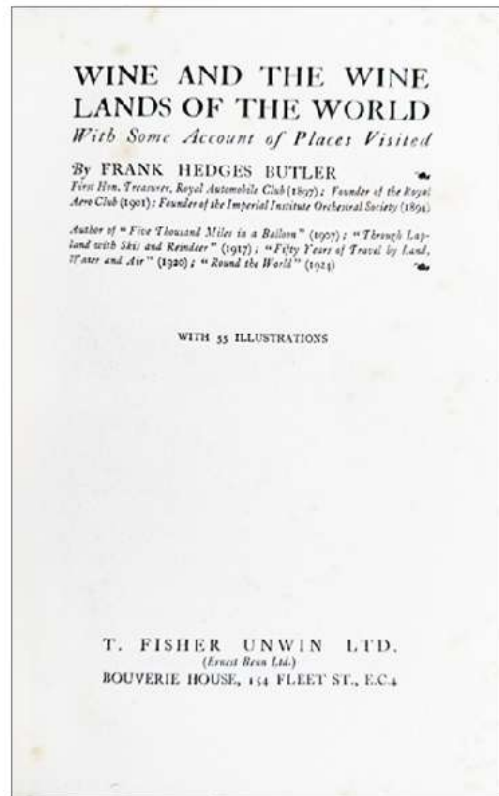
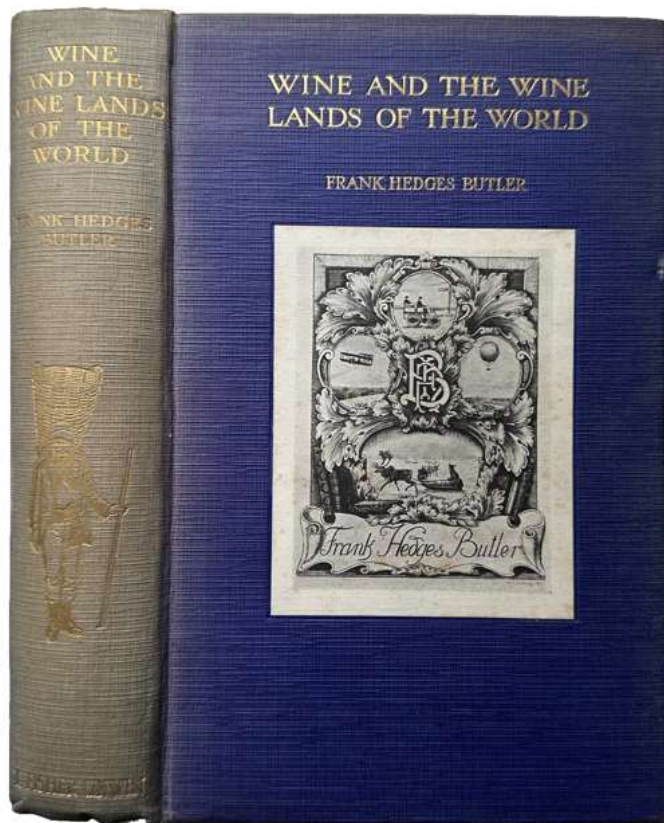
Heinrich Rudolf Schinz (1777-1861) born in Zürich, studied medicine at Würzburg and took his medical degree at Zürich (1798), studied zoology, taught natural history at the University of Zurich, serving conjointly as secretary and curator for the Zürich natural history society.

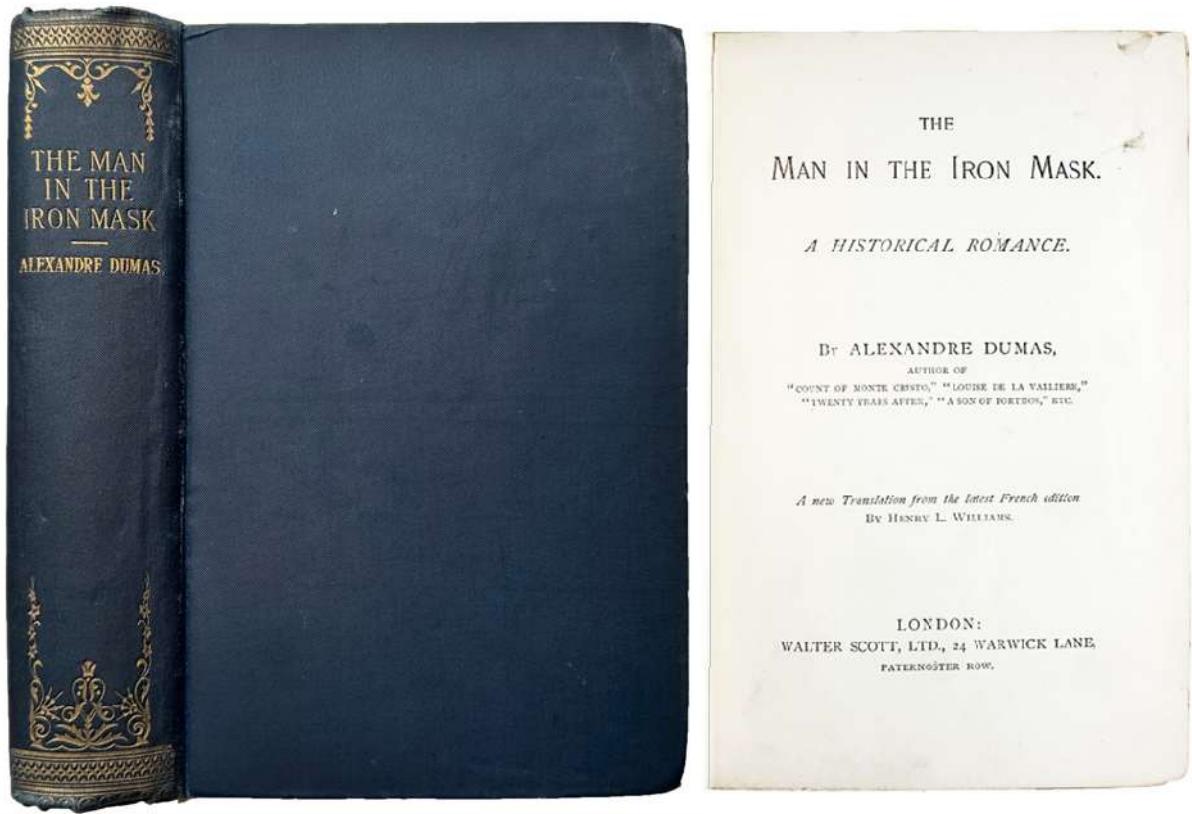
Colonel Kumar Sri Sir Ranjitsinhji Vibhaji II, often known as Ranji or K. S. Ranjitsinhji, was an Indian cricketer who later became ruler of his native Indian princely state of Nawanagar from 1907 to 1933. The main part of his cricket career was from 1893 to 1904 when, as one of the greatest batsmen of his time, he played for Cambridge University, Sussex, London County and, in 15 Test matches, for England. He has been called the "Father of Indian Cricket."



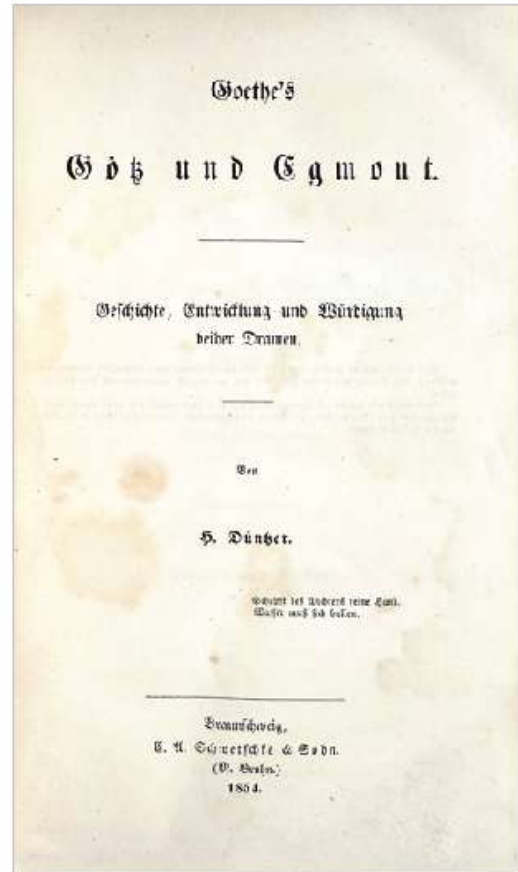
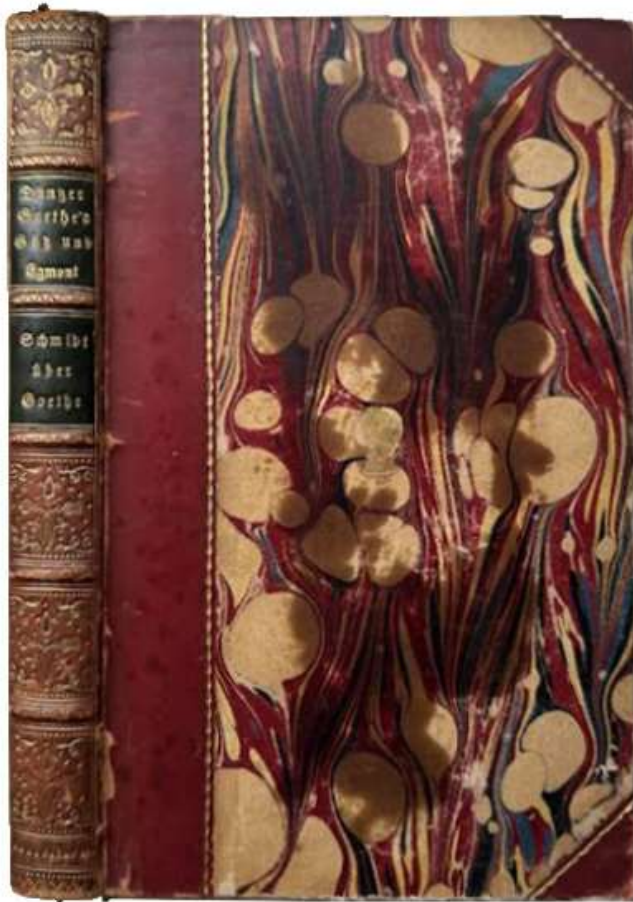

“In 1835, Fisk suffered another relapse in his battle with what appears to have been some sort of chronic respiratory disease. His physician advised him to take a sea voyage to try to regain his health. The trustees of the Wesleyan University were anxious for him to make a complete recovery and offered to let him take a year off to travel to Europe to acquire books and laboratory equipment for the university. Willbur and Ruth left New York in the company of a faculty member and friend, Wilbur B. Lane, in 1835. Before their departure in 1835 the Board of Fellows of Brown University awarded him a Doctor of Divinity degree.

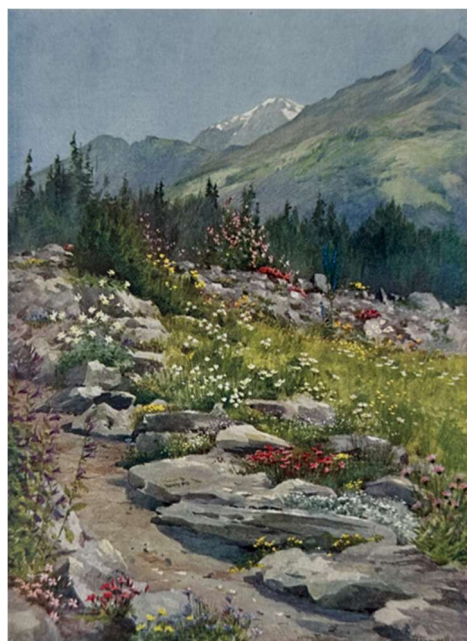
While in England, Fisk gave many sermons, and throughout his trip he was actively engaged in carrying out his assignment of acquiring supplies for the university. In addition to sightseeing, the European tour proved to be quite strenuous for his frail constitution. His health did improve, however, and after he returned to Middletown in 1836, he resumed his duties as president of the university. In 1838 Harper’s published his book describing the European tour: *Travels on the Continent Of Europe; Viz., In England, Ireland, Scotland, France, Italy, Switzerland, Germany, and The Netherlands.*” [Wikip.].



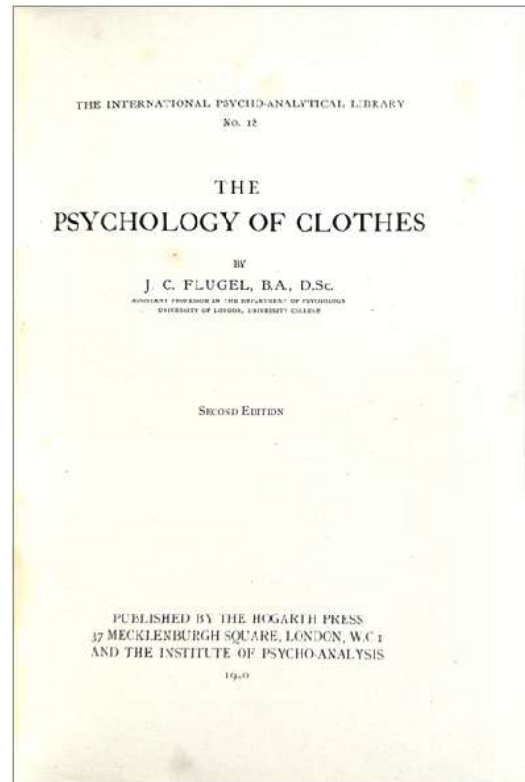
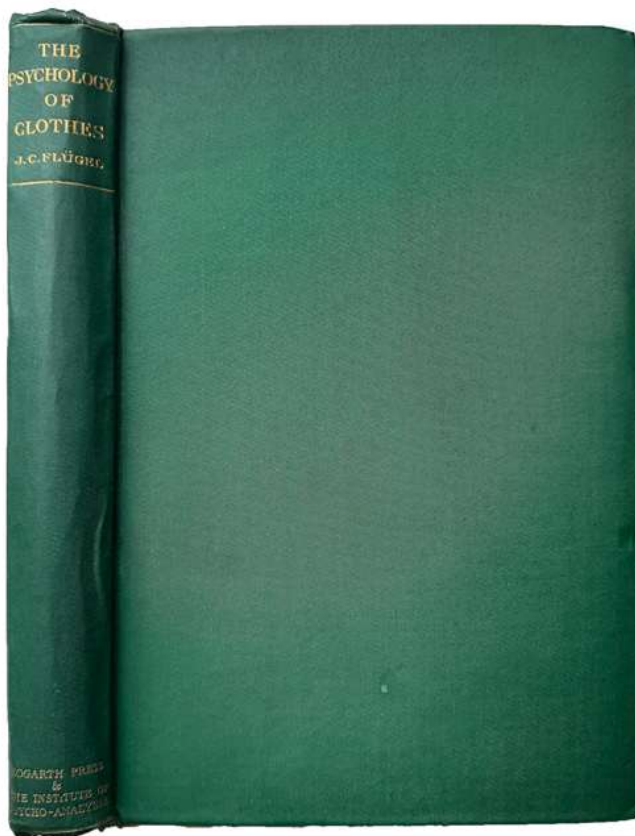

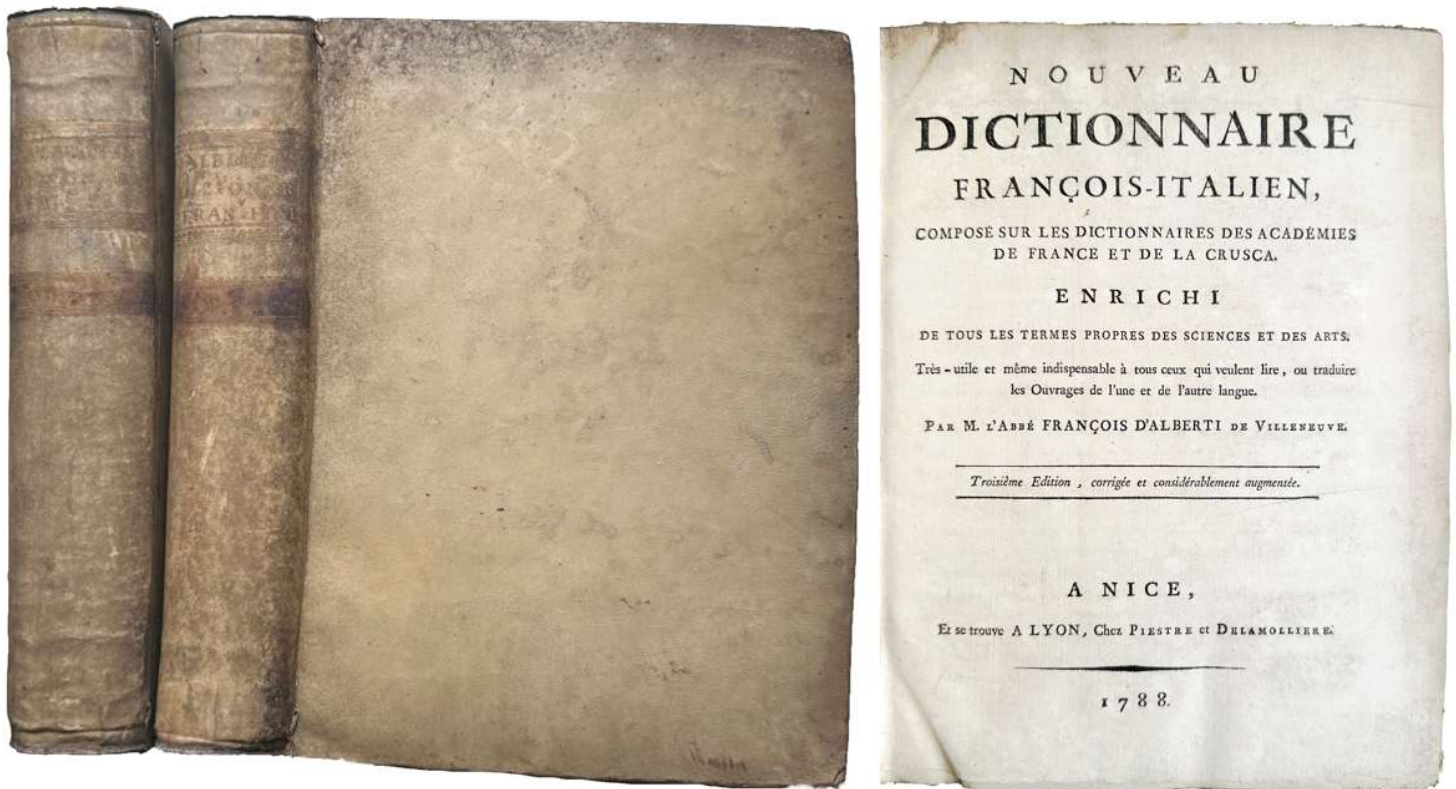

First issued in 1930. “J.C. Flügel’s 1930 book *The Psychology of Clothes* ranks among the most delightful and idiosyncratic of psychoanalytic texts. A staple of the literature in fashion studies, it has been largely overlooked and even forgotten within the analytic tradition. This may be because Flügel’s argument – in short, that men had collectively, since the late eighteenth-century revolutionary moment, ceded to women the pleasures of ornamentation and display that they themselves had enjoyed since the fall of Rome, abjuring the psychological gratifications of narcissistic display and adopting instead a drab uniformity in dress – was too out of step with his contemporaries’ morally tinged condemnations of clothing as frivolous.” – Christopher M. ON THE PORDOI PASS: THE MASSIVE BOËSPITZE, OR SELLA GROUP.





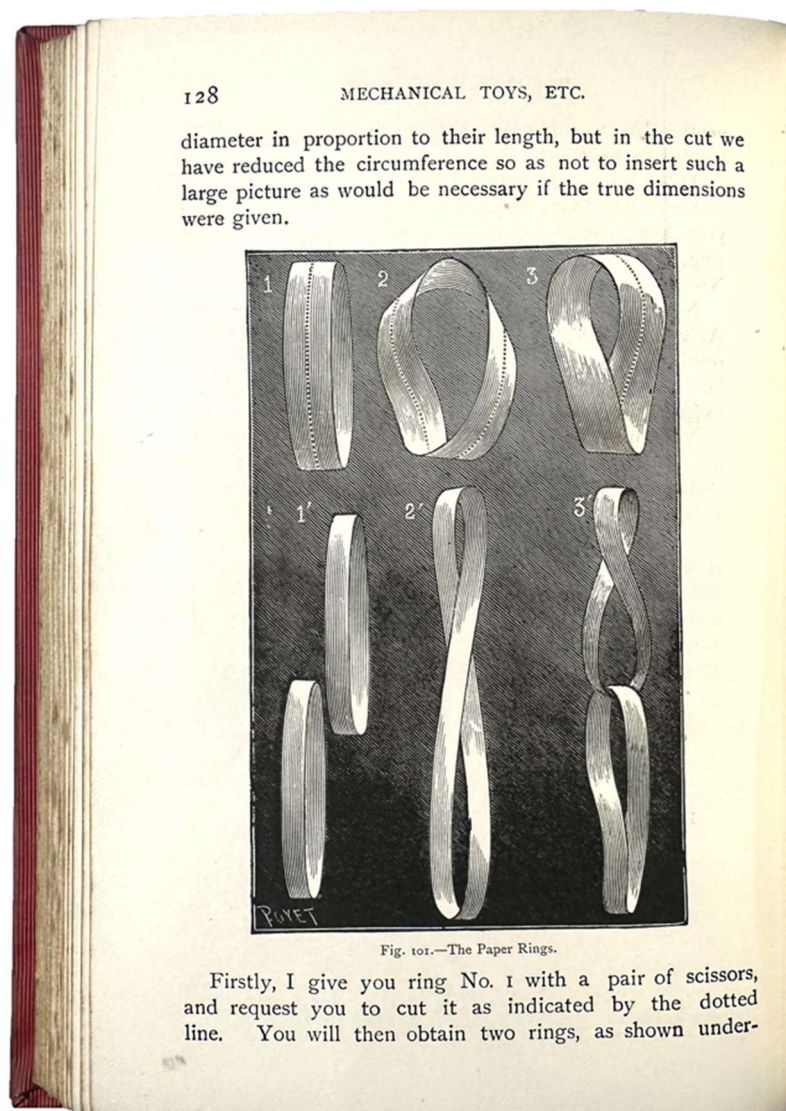

“In these modern days, the signboard is a very unimportant object: it was not always so. At a time when but few persons could read and write, house-signs were indispensable in city life. As education spread they were less needed; and when in the last century, the system of numbering houses was introduced, and every thoroughfare had its name painted at the beginning and end, they were no longer a positive necessity—their original value was gone, and they lingered on, not by reason of their usefulness, but as instances of the decorative humour of our ancestors, or as advertisements of established reputation and business success. For the names of many of our streets we are indebted to the sign of the old inn or public-house, which frequently was the first building in the street – commonly enough suggesting its erection, or at least a few houses by way of commencement. The huge “London Directory” contains the names of hundreds of streets in the metropolis which derived their titles from taverns or public-houses in the immediate neighbourhood. As material for the etymology of the names of persons and places, the various old signs may be studied with advantage. In many other ways the historic importance of house-signs could be shown.”



“Anecdotes and historical facts have been introduced with a double view; first, as authentic proofs of the existence and age of the sign; secondly, in the hope that they may afford variety and entertainment. They will call up many a picture of the olden time; many a trait of bygone manners and customs—old shops and residents,

old modes of transacting business, in short, much that is now extinct and obsolete. There is a peculiar pleasure in pondering over these old houses, and picturing them to ourselves as again inhabited by the busy tenants of former years; in meeting the great names of history in the hours of relaxation, in calling up the scenes which must have been often witnessed in the haunt of the pleasure-seeker,—the tavern with its noisy company, the coffee-house with its politicians and[vii] smart beaux; and, on the other hand, the quiet, unpretending shop of the ancient bookseller filled with the monuments of departed minds. Such scraps of history may help to picture this old London as it appeared during the last three centuries. For the contemplative mind there is some charm even in getting at the names and occupations of the former inmates of the houses now only remembered by their signs; in tracing, by means of these house decorations, their modes of thought or their ideas of humour, and in rescuing from oblivion a few little anecdotes and minor facts of history connected with the house before which those signs swung in the air.” – Preface.

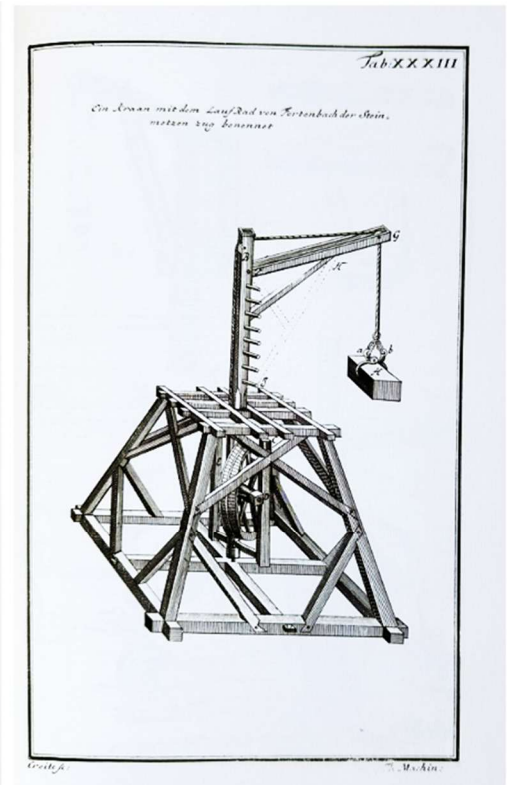
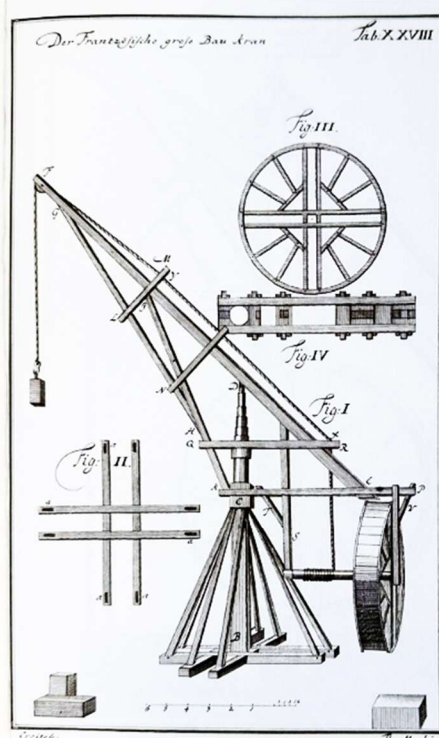
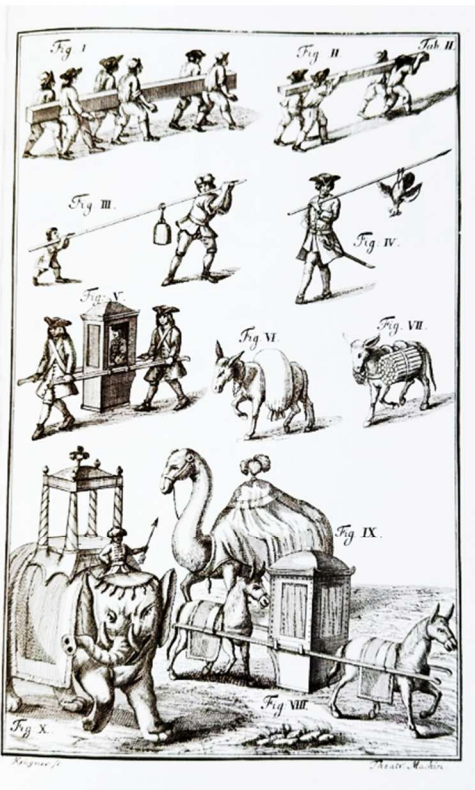

First edition of a richly illustrated account of the history and architecture of Moscow. It features delicate hand-colored aquatint views of the Kremlin by Edward Finden after Lavrof and a folding panorama (261 x 440 mm) which gives a “general front view” of the royal palace from the river Moskva. Lyall had practiced medicine in Russia, his experiences recorded here. A history of plagues in the 14th and 18th centuries is noted. He added a catalogue of plants found in the vicinity of Moscow, an essay on Russian architecture and an account of the burning of Moscow by Napoleon in 1814 (pp. 486-502). He describes mushrooms found in Russia.



Lyall was a physician, botanist, traveller. He was “born at Paisley in 1790, studied at Edinburgh University between 1801 and 1810, and proceeded M.D. there, but he spent some part of his early days at Manchester, studying plants, especially mushrooms. He appears to have been unsuccessful in his profession at home, although his papers on the irritability of plants, published in Nicholson’s *Journal* (vols. xxiv–viii.), 1809–11, attracted some attention among scientific botanists (cf. Royal Society’s Cat. Scientific Papers). According to his own account, he ‘twice found an asylum from misfortune and passed some of the best years of his life’ in the Russian empire, where he seems to have married and to have grown intimate with the czar’s physician, Sir Alexander Crichton [q. v.] In 1815 he resided in St. Petersburg as physician to a nobleman’s family, and he afterwards travelled to Kaluga with Mr. Pollaratskii. From 1816 to 1820 he was attached to the establishment of the Countess Orlof-Tchésmenska at Ostrof, sixteen miles from Moscow, in summer, and in winter at the ancient capital. In 1821 he was attending General Natschokin at Semeonovskoyé, near Moscow”.

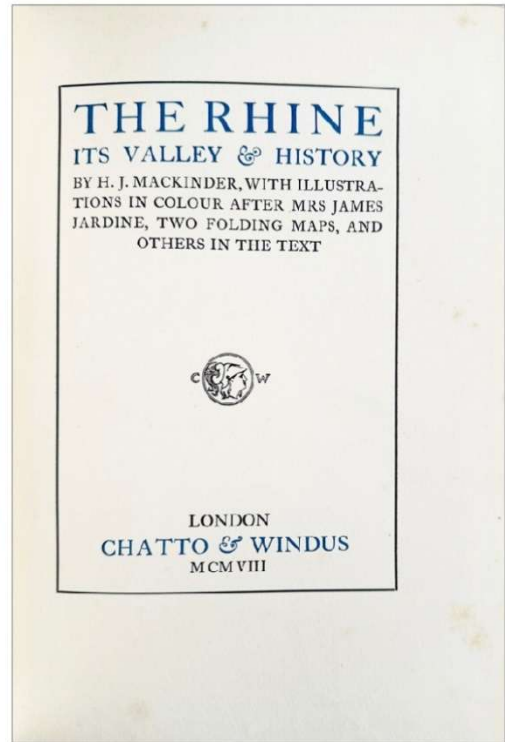
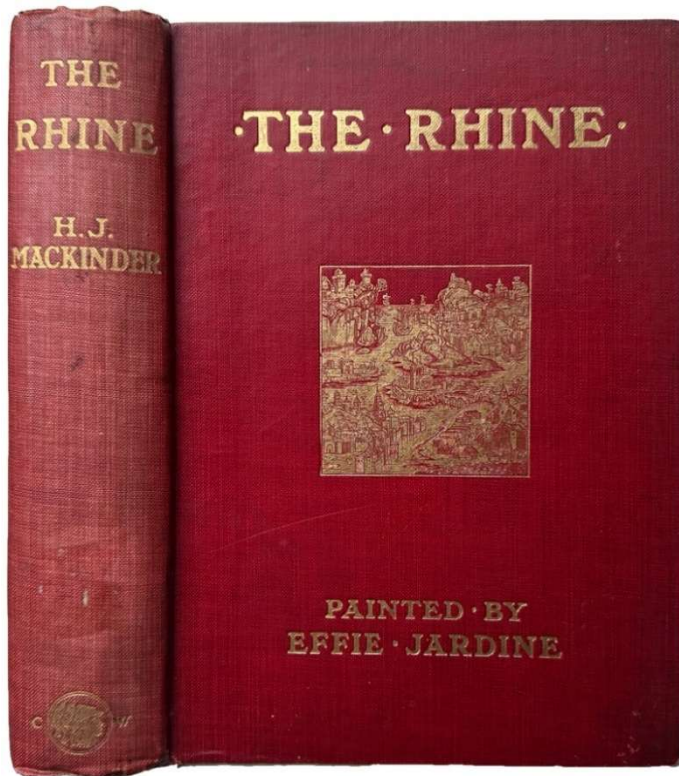
“From 22 April till August 1822 he travelled, in the double capacity of courier and physician, with the Marquis Pucci, Count Salazar, and Edward Penrhyn, through the Crimea, Georgia, and the southern provinces of Russia. He reached London from St. Petersburg in August 1823. While in England he published ‘The Character of the Russians and a detailed History of Moscow, illustrated with numerous Engravings, with a Dissertation on the Russian Language, and an Appendix containing Tables, political, statistical, and historical, an Account of the Imperial Agricultural Society of Moscow, a Catalogue of Plants found in and near Moscow, and an Essay on the Origin and Progress of Architecture in Russia,’ 4to, London and Edinburgh, 1823. In 1825 Lyall published his ‘Travels in Russia, the Krimea, the Caucasus, and Georgia,’ 2 vols. 8vo, London and Edinburgh. The journal of travel included a translation of the ‘Journal’ of General Vermótof’s embassy in 1817 to Persia, portions of which had appeared in Kotzebue’s ‘Voyage en Perse.’ Both works, which freely exposed the corruption and immorality of the Russian nobles and officials, gave great offence at St. Petersburg. His dedication of the first book to the Emperor Alexander was disavowed by the czar through the consul in London. In 1824 Lyall replied to the ‘Quarterly Review’s’ criticism of his first work, and published ‘*An Account of the Organisation, Administration, and Present State of the Military Colonies in Russia,*’ 1824”. – DNB.

The herbal book by the Italian physician and botanist Mattioli was first published in German in 1563, translated by Georg Handsch (1529-1578).

Mattioli's commentaries on plants was among the first texts to describe the tomato imported from America in 1544 and was also the first botanist to include the horse chestnut in a European herb book. Some of the illustrations are reproductions of the small-format woodcuts from the Valgrisi editions, others were cut by Peterlin after the original designs by Conrad Gessner. The illustrations depict flowers, herbs, vegetables and fruit-bearing plants.

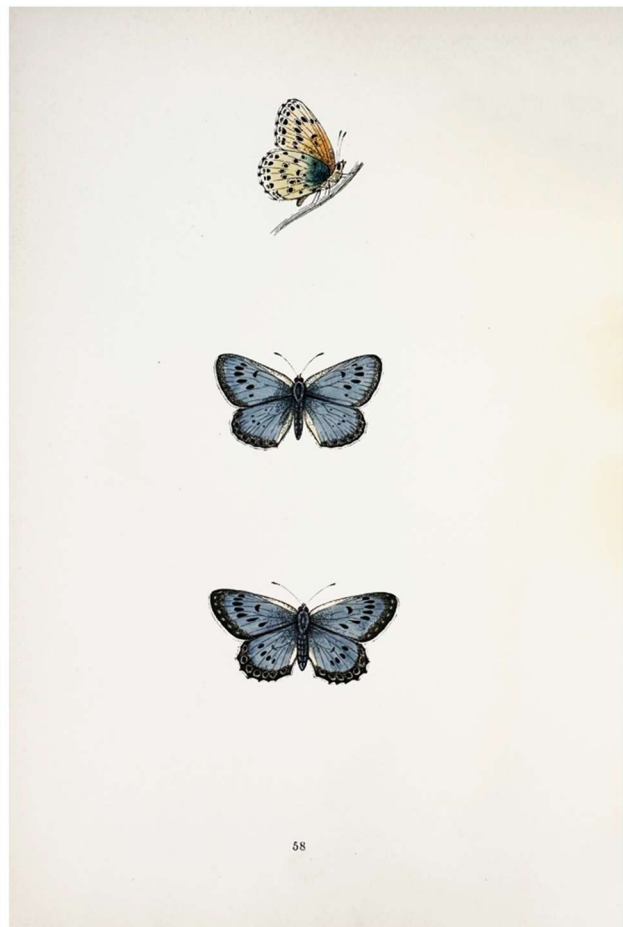
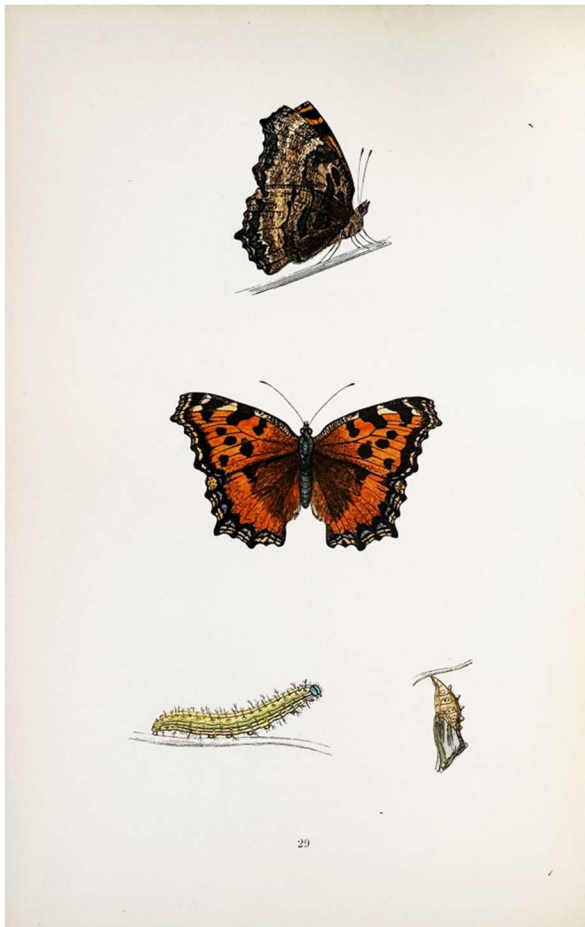
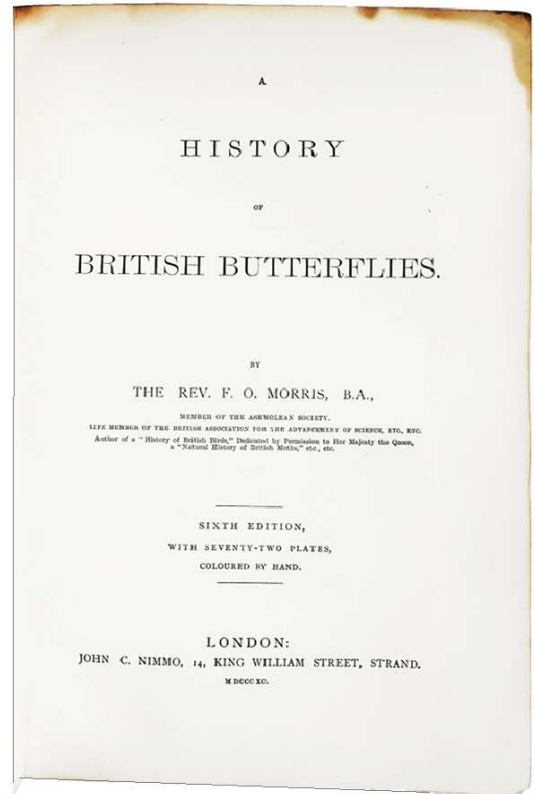
“Memoirs and Observations Made by a Traveler in England, on what is most remarkable.” This is an account of the British country, its sites, monuments, cities, and especially of London, all from the perspective of a Frenchman who was “condemned for exile” in England as he revoked the Edict of Nantes (thus circa 1685 or later). The revocation was signed by Louis XIV on October 18, 1685.

Son of the pastor of Sainte-Mère-Église, the young Maximilien Misson, like his father, was destined for the Protestant pastorate and studied in Geneva. Condemned to exile in England by the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, he abandoned his ecclesiastical career and became tutor to a young British aristocrat, Charles Hamilton, Earl of Arran, with whom he traveled for three years across Europe. He published his travel accounts, notably the one he made in Italy in *Nouveau Voyage d'Italie*, but also, in another work, the one François Leguat completed as far as Rodrigues Island and Mauritius. His name is attributed to one of the two founders of the perhaps imaginary pirate colony of Libertalia in the *General History of the Most Famous Pirates*, which is often attributed to Daniel Defoe. Discredited, he died in poverty in 1721. – Wikip.

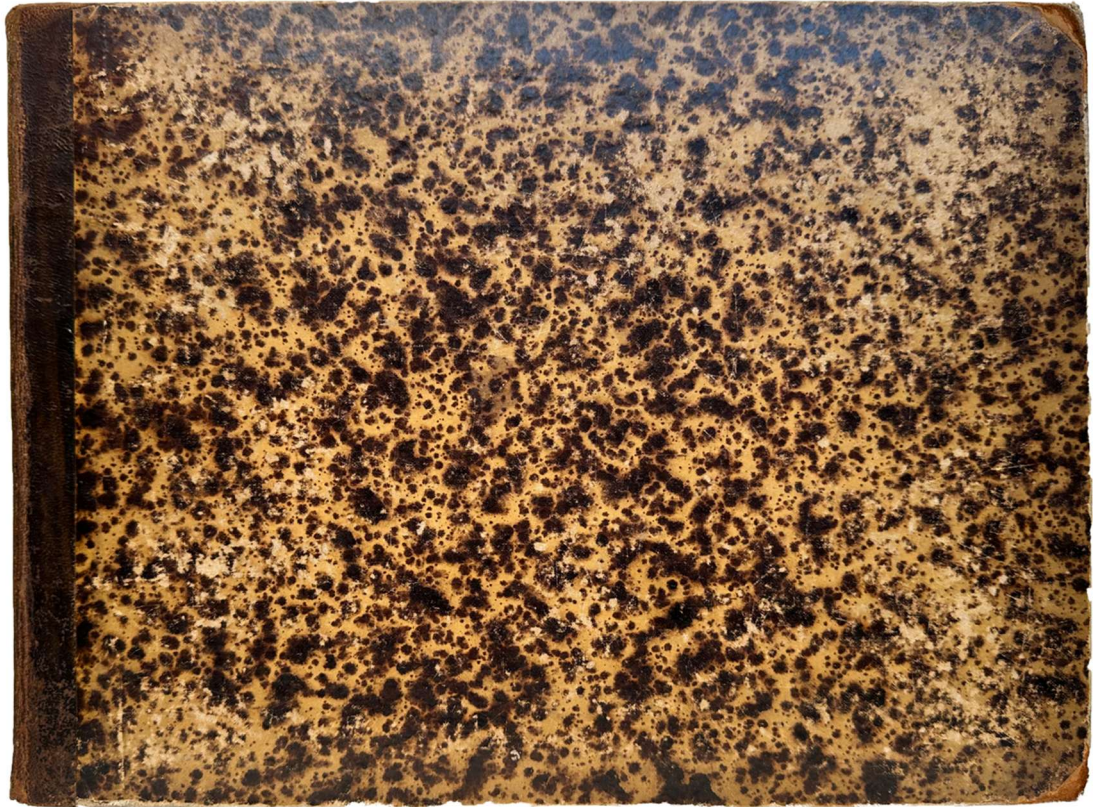

“Natural history, or scientific biology, was very popular in the 19th century. Many naturalists wrote about nature to argue for the existence of God because nature was far too complex and beautiful could not have been the work of anything else. Disciplines such as botany, geology, ornithology, physiology, and zoology all formed out of natural history and science.”

This “book is devoted to different butterflies of Great Britain. The first chapter is on the swallow-tail pictured above. Morris explains that it is the largest specimen in his holding and goes on to explain where the butterfly is commonly found around the world, and where it has been seen in Great Britain. The remainder of the chapter describes the butterfly’s physical attributes, along with a physical description of its caterpillar and chrysalis stage. He ends the chapter by stating: “the figure is taken from an unusually fine specimen in my own collection, bred 1851, from a chrysalis received with others from the Rev. 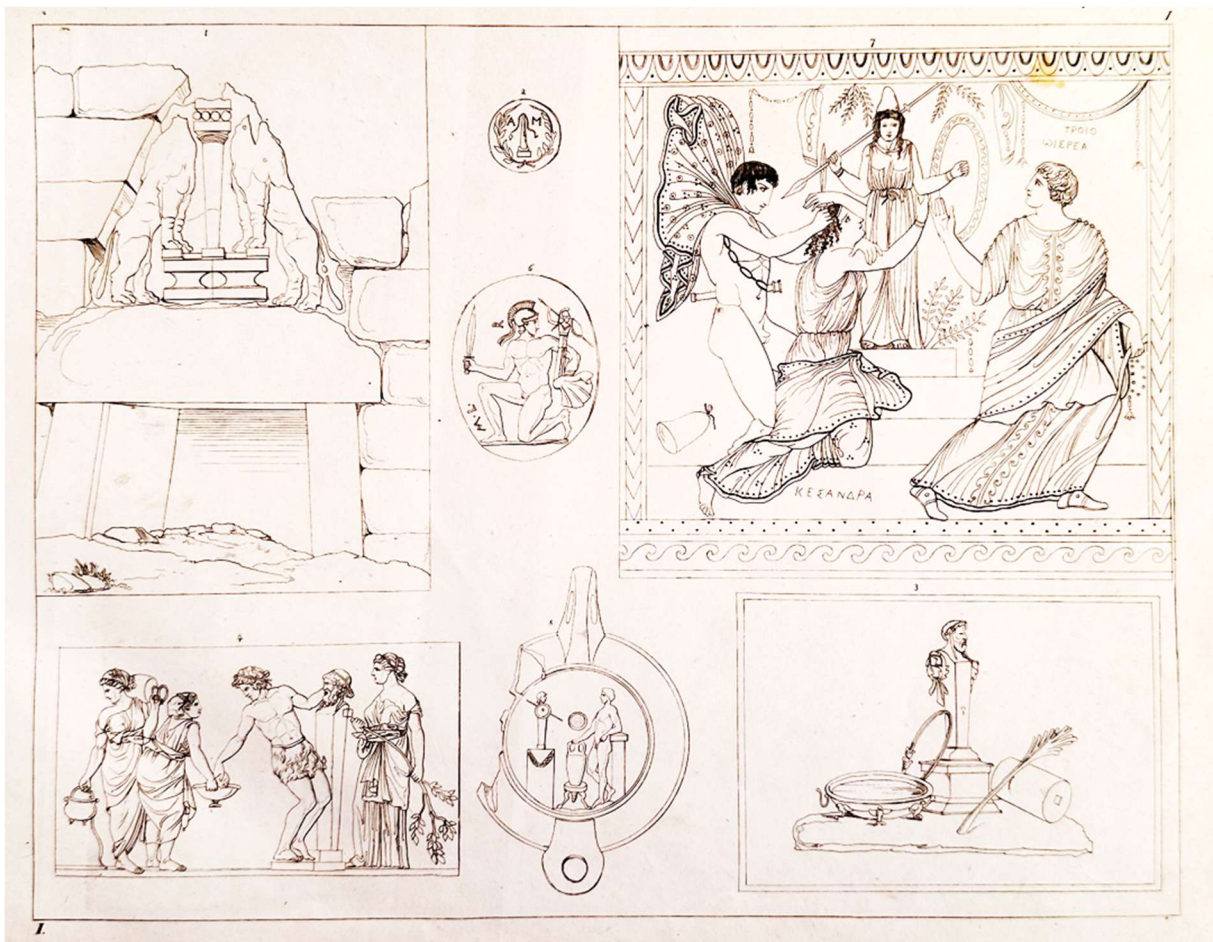

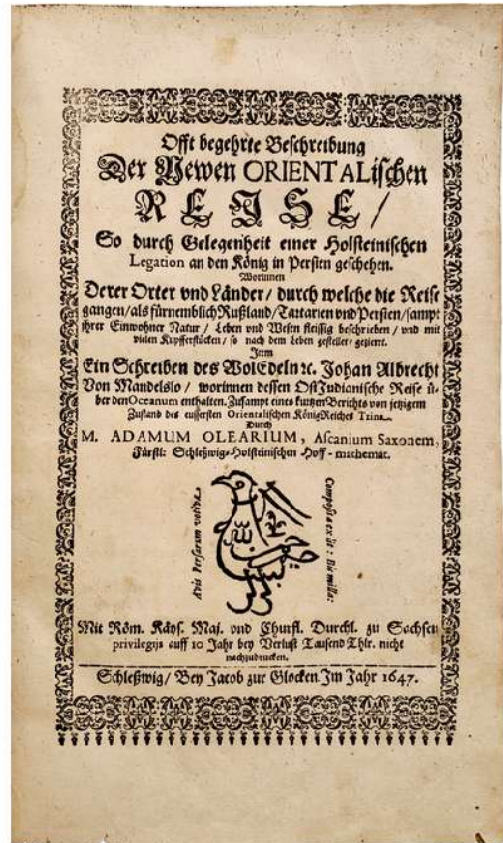

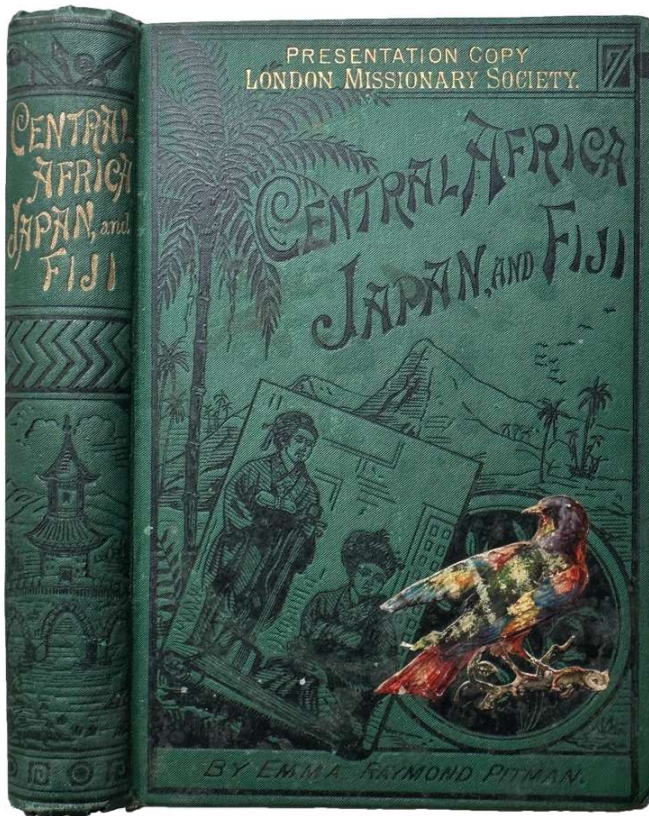


"The first edition of Olearius' account of his travels was published in 1647 in Schleswig under the title *Offt beehrte Beschreibung der neuen orientalischen Rejse, so durch Gelegenheit einer Holsteinischen Legation an d. König in Persien geschehen*. An extended and restructured edition appeared in 1656: *Vermehrte Neue Beschreibung der Muscowitischen und Persischen Reyse, so durch gelegenheit einer Holsteinischen Gesandschafft an den russischen Zaar und König in Persien geschehen* (reprint with a commentary by D. Lohmeier, Tübingen, 1971). The *Vermehrte Neue Beschreibung* is divided into six "books" of which the fourth treats the mission's route up to Isfahan, with detailed descriptions of Ardabil, Qazvin, Qom, Kasan, and their stay at the Safavid court. Book five is an encyclopedic description of Persia, covering aspects such as geography, fauna and flora, political institutions, manners, customs and clothing, Safavid history, education, language and script, trade, and religion. The return journey from Isfahan is the subject of book six. Amongst the numerous ethnographic observations, mention should be made of Olearius' depiction of the 'Asura ceremonies and other Shi'ite rituals, including the recitation of a "Machtelname" and the celebration of 'Ali's designation as the Prophet's successor ("Chummekater;" p. 435ff., 456ff.). Of interest for the history of printing is the regular insertion of Persian and Turkish quotations in the original script, serving as a model for the later account by Engelbert Kaempfer. The copper plate illustrations are of particular value, especially his detailed city views and the portrait of Shah 'afi. Modern scholars such as Strack, Emerson, and Brancaforte have presented different views on the question of Olearius' objectivity and the extent to which he was affected by contemporary assumptions (Strack; Brancaforte; Emerson). "Olearius provided the first comprehensive description of Persia since antiquity, but his achievements appear less significant when compared with the far broader range and experience of later travelers who wrote after him in the course of the 17 century" (Lohmeier, p. 59). Still, all later travelogues are heavily indebted to him, and his work can be studied as a starting point for the genre. His outstanding contribution to the cartography of Persia is his *Nova Delineatio Persiae et Confiniorvm veteri longe accuratior edita Anno 1655*, the first realistic map of Iran that, in particular, corrects the location and form of the Caspian Sea." – *Encyclopedia Iranica*.



Olearius, "Born in 1599 (with the German name Ohlschlegel, later Olschlager), Olearius studied theology, mathematics, astronomy, and geography at the University of Leipzig. After various teaching assignments, in 1633 he entered the service of Frederick III (1597-1659), ruler of the Duchy of Schleswig-Holstein-Gottorp. As secretary and counselor, he took part in the diplomatic missions to Russia and Persia that were aimed at negotiating a new direct trade route for Persian silk. After the initial consent of the Tsar, the embassy set out for Persia in 1635. Taking the route through Moscow and following the Volga to Astrakhan, they entered Persia after crossing the Caspian Sea at Sama'-i. There, the delegation had to wait for three months before they were allowed to proceed. Olearius used the time to acquire a basic knowledge of Persian and Arabic. Their route then took them from Ardabil, Qazvin, and Kasan to Isfahan, the capital. After a stay of several months, the mission returned without concrete results by a similar route, this time passing through Rast. Olearius continued his service in Gottorp as court mathematician and principal of the extensive court library and collections (Kunstammer). He was deeply engaged in the baroque literary scene of his time and achieved wide international recognition. He died in 1671 and was buried in Schleswig (Lohmeier)." – *Encyclopedia Iranica*.

“During the 1730s and 1740s, Réaumur’s worked on his proposed ten-volume *Mémoires pour servir à l’histoire des insectes* (Memoirs to illustrate the history of insects, 1734–42). Only six volumes of the work were completed in Réaumur’s lifetime, but they contain several groundbreaking studies. Perhaps the most significant is in volume two, which addresses the influence of temperature on the life cycle and development of insects. Réaumur went about exploring this question with his usual thoroughness, keeping pupae in warm and cool conditions and noting the moths’ emergence times. Using these observations, he was able to estimate population increases under different conditions. Réaumur also included the impact of parasites and predators on butterfly populations, studying how population increases are controlled and how weather conditions affect both predator and prey”.



“Volume five of Réaumur’s *Mémoires* focuses on bees and flies. His work with bees is particularly noteworthy because he began to delve into the manner in which bees communicate, something that had not been researched before. Methodically, Réaumur tracked individual bees, dissected them and discovered parasites inside them, recorded hibernation temperatures, and elucidated the function of the queen and how the hive responded when she was taken away or when new queens were introduced. In essence, he documented every aspect of bee biology that he could. The seventh volume of *Mémoires* was never finished, but the partial manuscript includes documentation of Réaumur’s observations of ant diet and hibernation patterns, ant-aphid interactions, mating biology, and ant predation of flowers of fruit trees”. – EBSCO.

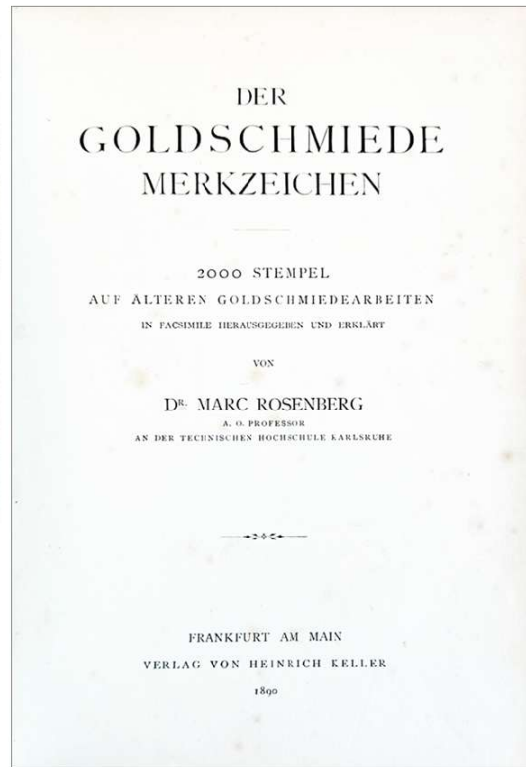
René-Antoine Ferchault Reaumur (1683-1757) was a French entomologist known for his contributions to natural history and metallurgy during the early 18th century. He combined his interests in entomology with the intersection of botany and their relationships. "Réaumur became a member of the French Academy of Sciences in 1708 and significantly influenced scientific inquiry in France through his eclectic research interests. 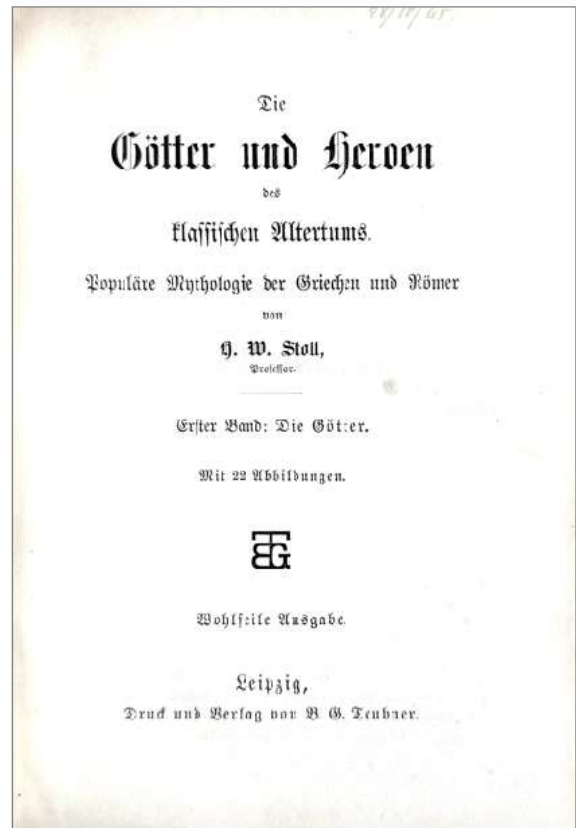
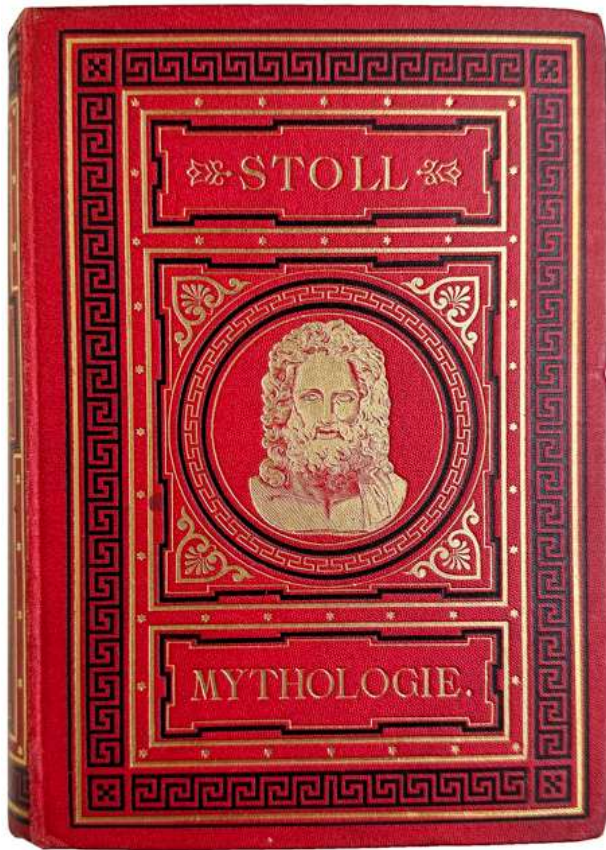
With the large folding plate of Geneva and the surrounding area, showing Lac Lemman / Lake Geneva, and all the small municipalities that dot the region (such as Eyvan = Evian, Morges, the mountainous terrain, there are even a few cows shown in the plate. The city view of Geneva (p. 148) shows the original wall at the city

entrance. Spon was a numismatist, thus his interest is shown (p. 107) with a plate devoted to early coinage of the city. The frontispiece features a view of Geneva with Saint Pierre Cathedral as a focal point. That cathedral dates from 1150 and was founded in the 4th century.



With this text one learns of the origin of the name for the city of Geneva, derived from the Latin word for the Juniper shrub which populated the hilly regions there.

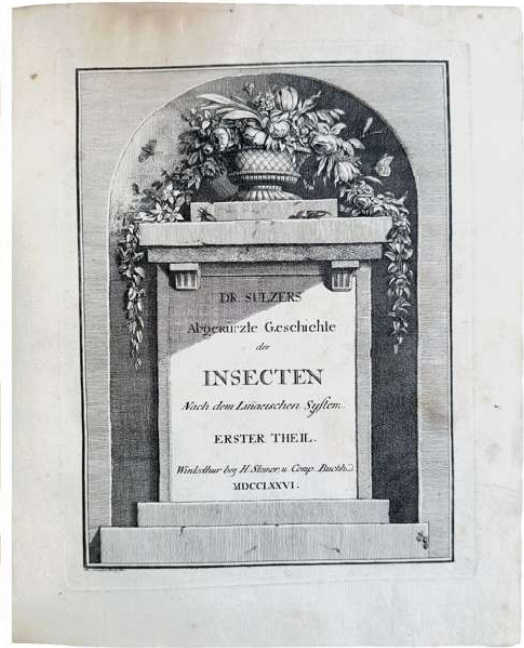

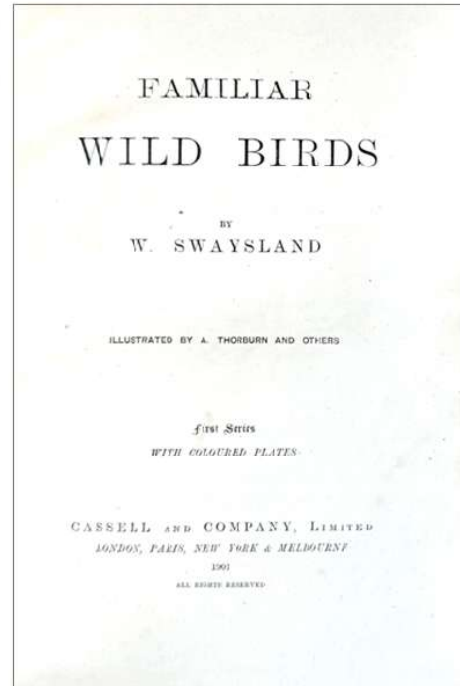
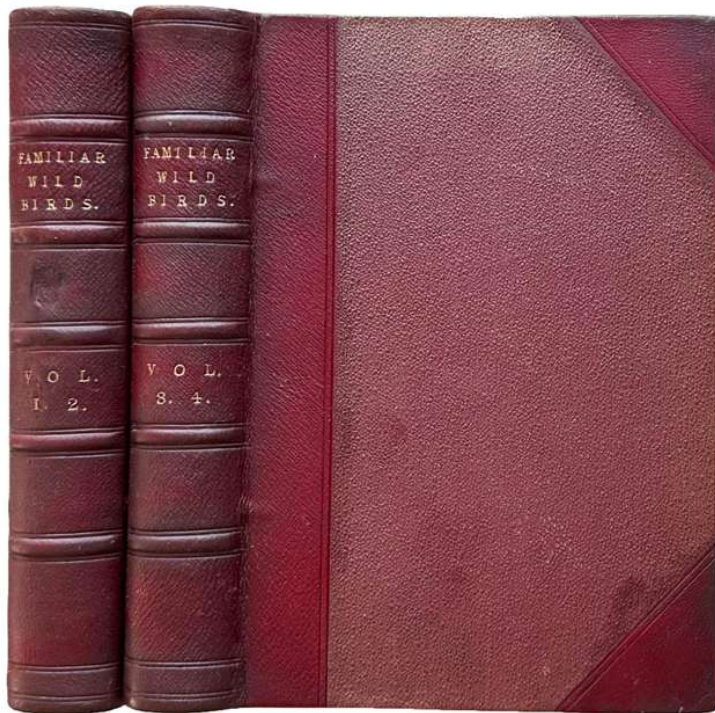

“*Familiar Wild Birds* is considered a seminal work of ornithology (the study of birds) as it contains scientific details about each species to help with recognition, including size, colouring, and number of eggs – these are often paired with advice on how to capture and keep the birds as pets, a practice that has been thankfully left in the past. Each bird is also given the ‘Swaysland’ treatment with funny anecdotes and observations on each bird’s personality that make the book accessible to a wide audience. While the Starling is ‘more or less gregarious’, the Robin is ‘an efficient member of [the] self-constituted bird police’, and Swaysland even warns that the Jay is ‘naturally inquisitive and somewhat mischievous, and should therefore be carefully watched’. THIS bird, which is also called the Guernsey Partridge, and French Partridge, although possessing many characteristics in common with the English bird, is, however, quite distinct from it; and in nearly all localities where the former has gained a footing the latter has gradually become scarcer. Martin Zeiler was a Baroque era German author. His father was an exile from Upper Styria, forced to emigrate due to his protestant confession. Zeiler was schooled in Ulm, moving to Wittenberg in 1608 to study jurisprudence and history. He worked several jobs as private teacher and notary. He lived in Ulm from 1629, working as teacher and inspector at local schools. Zeiler was very productive as an author, meeting the template of the Baroque polyhistor. The Ulm city library lists 90 works authored by Zeiler. His productivity was recognized by his contemporaries; Georg Philipp Harsdörffer mentions Herrn Zeillers proverbial industriousness in one of his poems. Zeiler is best known for his contribution to Matthäus Merian's *Topographia Germaniae* (16 vol., 1642–1654). This item is a small extract from that massive work, this part applying to modern day Switzerland (German states).

The fragment above follows a 17th century German text on Switzerland, dealing with: Zurich, Bern, Lucern, Uri, Schwantz(?), Unterwalden [Unterwalden], Zug, Glaris, Basel, Freiburg, Solothurn, Schaf[f]hausen & Appenzell.
